Dear Blidworth Parish Council,

I am writing under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to formally request the following information:

1. A copy of the Parish Council's minutes relating to the agreement or discussion of the **Modification Order for access across my property**.
 - Please redact any personal information or content not relevant to the modification in accordance with GDPR.

2. Confirmation of **how many Councillors agreed to the submission of this Modification Order**, and whether this was voted on during a Parish Council meeting.

As a regular attendee of Parish Council meetings for over a year, I note that this matter has never appeared on any public meeting agenda. Given that the Modification Order appears to have implications for the residents of Blidworth, I am concerned about the lack of transparency and community engagement in this decision.

If this information cannot be provided, I can only assume that the Modification Order was not formally agreed through a Parish Council meeting and properly voted upon. In that case, I would insist that the Parish Council **withdraw the application immediately** until the appropriate procedure has been followed, allowing residents the opportunity to provide their views and input before any decisions are made.

These situation raises concerns regarding the Parish Council's adherence to the **Seven Principles of Public Life** (Nolan Principles), particularly openness, accountability, and integrity.
